John's anxiety at work continues to reduce. He practices replacing negative self-talk with positive self-talk and this appears to be improving his anxiety. Treatment plan will continue, but will reduce therapy sessions to once every fortnight. John will continue focusing on strengthening his relationships with friends, family members, and colleagues.
