	Hamilton's arrival in American meant a chance to leave behind his questionable origins.
	Assume your reader has some knowledge of the text. Consider your audience to be your classmates. Use details as examples, not to retell the whole story.
	Refer to authors by their full name or their last name.
	Refer to characters as they are most commonly referred to in the text.
	Alexander Hamilton or Hamilton, Eliza Schuyler or Eliza, etc.
