Removable Partial Denture

- Base Camp: Strong, lightweight acrylic, often metal-reinforced for stability.
- Smile Squad: Replacement teeth that look and work like the real deal.
- Clasp Crew: Metal anchors that keep your RPD securely in place.

Downsides

- Gummy Friction: Rubbing against gums, takes time to adjust.
- Chew Carefult Bite strength not ideal, adapt your diet.
- Clasp Caution: Pressure on remaining teeth, future concerns possible.



Dental Bridge

- Gap Filler: Bridges replace missing teeth nestled between existing ones.
- Crown Crew: Strong caps on flanking teeth anchor the bridge.
- Pontic Posse: Tooth-like replacements restore bite and smile.

Downsides

- Strength Test: Requires strong teeth for support, risk increases with multiple missing teeth.
- Crown Concerns: Reshaping needed for crowns, potential leaks can lead to decay under them.
- No Anchors? No teeth for a bridge?
 Consider implants instead.



Dental Implant Bridge

- No weak anchors: No need for fragile natural teeth, implants take the load.
- Strong & stable: Anchored by implants, this bridge won't budge.
- Bone-saving hero: Implants prevent bone loss, keeping your jaw healthy.

Downsides

- Costlier start. Implants come with a bigger price tag upfront.
- Bone building: Missing teeth for long? You might need bone grafting.
- Time investment: Potience is key, healing takes time.
