INTRODUCTION

- Adelescents are individuals in the 10-19 years age group, and described as a phase of life between childhood and adulthood
- In the Philippines, adolescence accounts for 26% of the population.
- Adolescence is a unique stage of human development and an important time for laying the foundations of good health
- Lifestyle and health behavior portions in adolescence are more tikely to persist until adulthood including the choice of being physically active

The Philippines ranked 2nd out of 146 countries in 2019 with the most number of physically inactive school children.



Worldwide, 81% of adolescents aged 11-17 years do not meet WHO's global recommendations on physical activity*.



There is overwhelming evidence for the lifelong health benefits of a physically active lifestyle and the health risks of inactivity and sedentary behavior from adolescence to adulthood.
