Objectives

- Learn the procedure for gathering for a read-aloud
- Hear and discuss a story
- Answer questions about key details in the story
- Listen carefully
- Gather in a responsible way
- Learn and use the words *tumble* and *swirl*
- Build their speaking and listening skills

Materials

- *McDuff Moves In*, Word cards (wA1), Day 1 prompts (wA2), Copies of introductory family letter

Whole Group

1. Introduce the reading program to the students. Discuss the importance of sharing your thinking and listening carefully to one another.
2. Introduce gathering procedures and practice. Model how to sit and be a good listener.
3. Introduce *McDuff Moves In*. Show the cover. Discuss author and illustrator.
4. **Read Aloud:** Read the story aloud slowly and clearly, showing the illustrations. Clarify vocabulary as you encounter it in the text by reading the word, briefly defining it, rereading it in context, and continuing (for example, "Through an open window in the kitchen of number seven Elm Road wafted—wafted means 'floated'—wafted the smell of vanilla rice pudding and sausages.")
5. **Discuss the story:** Facilitate discussion: Why does the little white dog go to Fred and Lucy's house? What in the story makes you think that? Why do you think Fred drives around in circles? How do Fred and Lucy come up with a name for McDuff?
6. **Reflect:** What did you enjoy about hearing and discussing *McDuff Moves In* today? Explain that it will be revisited tomorrow. Practice transition procedures.

Whole Group

1. **Practice procedures for gathering and discuss responsibility:** Explain that one way the students work responsibly during Making Meaning lessons is by gathering and returning to their desks in an orderly way. That is important because gathering and returning to their desks in an orderly way ensures that no one gets hurt.
2. **Review the story and explain the purpose of rereading:** Show the cover of *McDuff Moves In*. Ask: What do you remember about this story? Explain that today you will reread *McDuff Moves In* aloud.
