The Effects of a Graphic Organizer Training Package on the Persuasive Writing of Middle School Students with Autism Anne Bishop, 2013 Abstract This study examined the effects of a direct instruction and graphic organizer intervention package on the quality and quantity of persuasive writing of middle school students with Autism Spectrum Disorder ASD Quality of students writing was measured via analytical rubric scores and correct word sequences Quantity was measured by assessing total words written Students were between the ages of 12 and 14 and all four participants had been diagnosed with ASD A multiple baseline across participants design was used to evaluate intervention effectiveness Findings indicated that the quality and quantity of the students persuasive writing improved as a result of the intervention
